



- Co-chair Jill Thornton announced that the AAC is piloting a peer assessment mentoring initiative that will pair seasoned AAC members with newer members. The co-chairs believe it will provide an opportunity for seasoned members to “coach” new members, and for new members to receive ongoing and direct support from subcommittee chairpersons and their mentors. Jill also thanked governance representatives on each campus for announcing the AAC’s need for new members to their respective bodies.

Lisa Aymong, Professor of Nursing presented the Assessment Awards templates she developed as part of a SUNY Council on Assessment leadership course. She believes it would be a great way to highlight exceptional assessment work happening at the College, and serve as an incentive for academic departments and AES units to remain engaged in assessment throughout the year.
