Word of the foundation's closing also drew people touched by its work, includ-ing Staff Sgt. Dadmarie Al-varado, 38, of Bayamon, Pu-erto Rico, who is stationed at Fort Knox in Kentucky. In 2004 and 2009, she re-ceived Kenney's packages during deployments to Iraq and Afghanistan. "You guys do not know what that meant," said Alva-rado, who came to Long Is-land and spoke passionately
