HOT WORK PERMIT

All temporary operations involving open flames or producing heat and/or sparks require a Hot Work Permit. This includes, but is not limited to, brazing, cutting, grinding, soldering, thawing and welding. The work area must be inspected by a responsible supervisor before the issuance of a Hot Work Permit.
