## Students Seeking Matriculation

A student whose high school class has not yet graduated, and who applies for admission to a degree prag at Suffolk County Community College, may be admitted under the following conditions:

- 1. the student must have no more than one year of high school studies remaining;
- 2. the high school principal must provide the College with a written requiest f early admision;
- 3. the student's high school guidance counselor must recommend the student for admission;
- 4. the student must be beyond the age of compulsory attendance in New York State (i.e., the end of the high school year in which the student1160)msnd

in special circumstances by the D Student Services and Dean of Fa

classes at Suffolk County Community College as a matriculated student, may under the following conditions:

- the student must have no more than two years of high school stud remaining;
- both the high school principal and the studegtisdance counselor m provide the College with recommendations indicating that the student requisite maturity to benefit from collegevel instruction; and
- 3. if the student is below the age of compulsory attendance in NewStar. (i.e., the end of the high school year in which the student turned 10 permission to attend durinither the fall and/or spring semesters is contingent upon concurrent high school attendance.

Exceptions to the requirements outlined in 1, 2 and 3 above may be authorized in special circumstances by the Director of Admissions with the approval of the Dean of Student Services and/or Dean of Faculty.
